Renewable resource

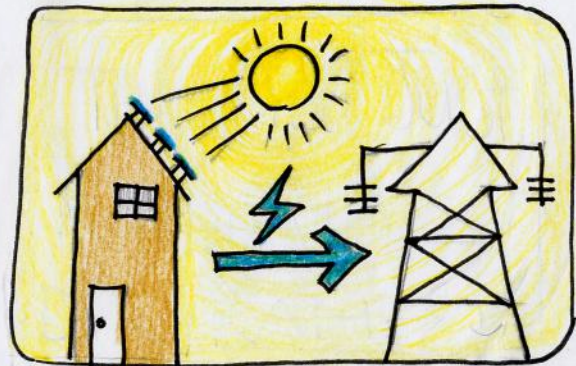


But if solar panels depend on Sunlight, then how does it work at night? Do we store the electricity in batteries?

During night, we use surplus power back from the grid.

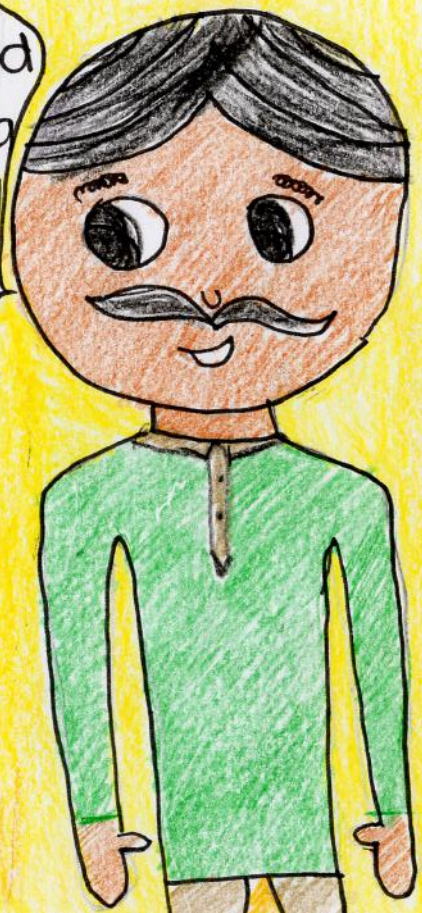
That is why you pay less money for electricity.



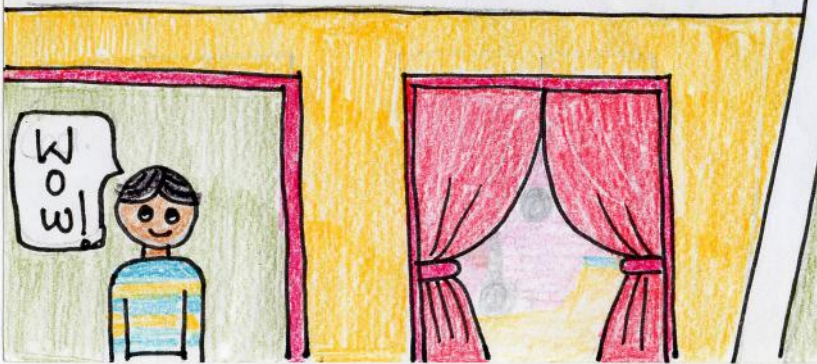
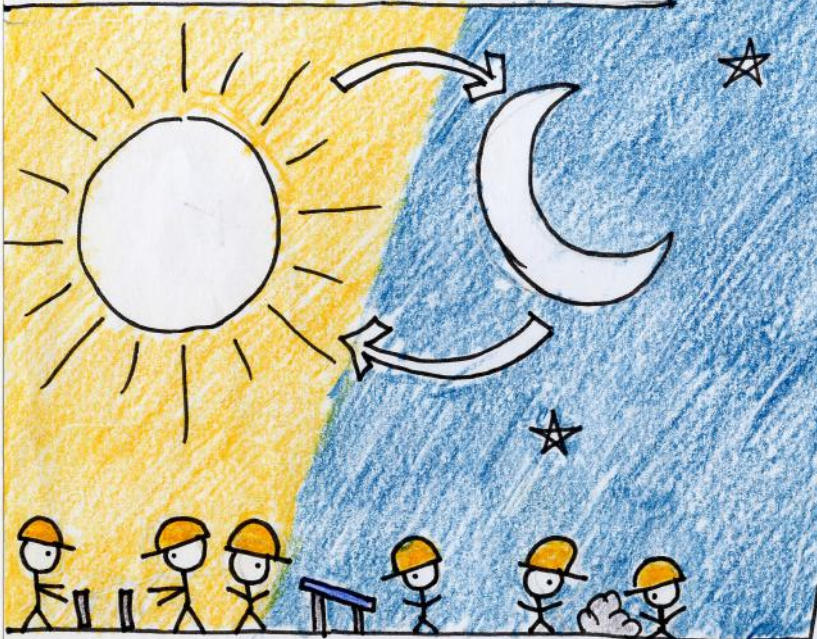

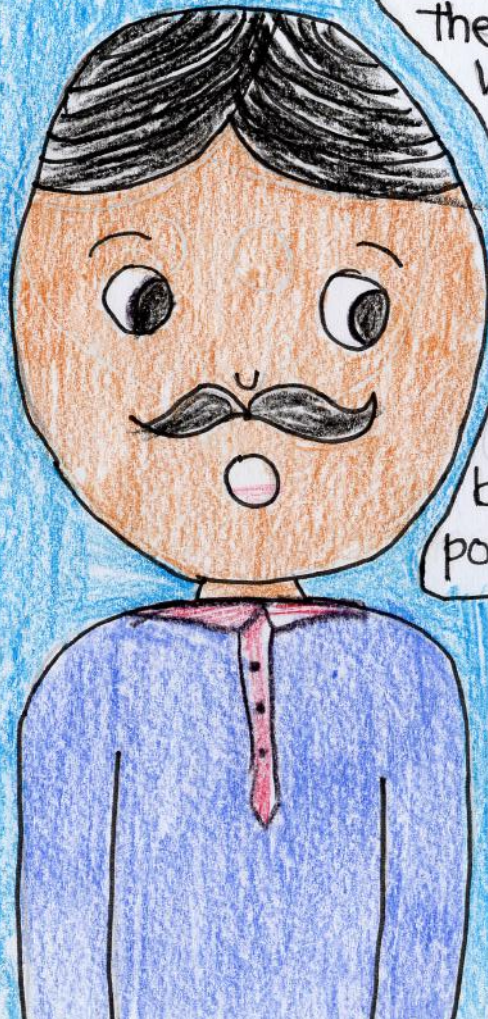
